Re: Beef & Dairy Finished Steer ID Day – Saturday, March 13th

Saturday, March 13th is ID day for all beef steers, commercial and market heifers, and dairy (finished) steers *AT THE SWINE BARN (note change of location for this year)*. Beef project animals will be weighed and ear tagged from 8:00 am until 10:00 am. Dairy steers will be weighed and tagged from *approximately* 10:30 am until 12:00 pm.

Beef ID Worksheet

Attached please find a copy of the Indiana 4-H Beef ID Worksheet. *Please have the worksheet completed as much as possible BEFORE arriving!* The purpose of this worksheet is to record your animals' information to assist you when you sit down at the computer to enter your animals in the 4HOnline Animal ID system.

4HOnline Animal ID Requirement – by March 20th!

After your animals have been weighed and tagged, *it is the responsibility of the 4-H families to enter the information that appears on the ID Worksheet into 4HOnline.* Attached are step-by-step instructions for identifying your animals at https://v2.4honline.com. We ask that you strive to complete the online ID no later than March 20th. Why wait? Get it done. *(NOTE: If your 4Honline account is in a status other than 'Approved', you will not be able to access your account to input your animal ID information. Please contact Joan at joangrott@purdue.edu to find out how to take care of this now so that your account becomes active as soon as possible.)*

Livestock Location Form

Also attached is the Livestock Location Form. 4-H animals are to be in the personal possession and/or regular care of the 4-H member who owns/leases them by the date specified in each of the livestock project rules in order to exhibit at the county and state fairs (though for 2021, the beef date has been extended to March 13th, rather than February 1st.). This form is necessary for all livestock exhibitors and is *due by May* 15th. (Complete the paper form -OR- complete the online form at http://bit.ly/2021PorterCoLocation.)

Indiana 4-H & Indiana Board of Animal Health Official ID Information Indiana 4-H will no longer be utilizing retinal imaging technology. It is important that 4-H animals are properly identified according to Indiana 4-H Animal Identification requirements, as well as complying with

Face coverings properly worn to cover the mouth and nose are expected of all volunteers, staff, and 4-H families in attendance.

Please wait your turn outside. Only one household at a time permitted inside the barn while their animals are being weighed and tagged.

Please avoid congregating as you wait. Please keep six feet of social distancing and face coverings in mind if you choose to visit with fellow 4-H families outside the barn.

Hand sanitizer and surface sanitizer will be available for use inside the barn. Hightouch areas like the check-in table and shared tools will be sanitized frequently throughout the day.

If you have come into contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the past two weeks and/or if you are experiencing any of the following COVID-19 signs and symptoms, please stay at home and make alternate arrangements to have your animals transported to ID Day:

- Fever/chills
- Cough/sore throat
- Runny nose
- Fatigue
- Shortness of breath/ difficulty breathing
- Headache/ muscle aches

^{*}Official collection envelopes will be available at the 4-H Building on March 13th, or upon request at the Extension Office at your convenience. For instructions on collecting hair samples, go to http://bit.ly/IN4HBeef.

For registered heifers not attending tag day, appropriate 840 tags are available upon request at ID day, at the Extension Office, or you are encouraged to obtain your own supply of official 840 tags elsewhere. (Your PremID number will be required in exchange for 840 tags.) PREMISES ID NUMBERS

Indiana state law requires that anyone who owns property where livestock (cattle, swine, sheep, goats, cervids) is kept to register the premises with the Indiana State Board of Animal Health. All beef cattle must be identified in the Indiana 4-H Online Animal ID system by May 15th or earlier deadline set by the county.

State Fair eligibility, all beef and dairy beef steers, dairy feeder steers, market heifers and commercial heifers must have an 840-RFID tag and a county tag and registered heifers must have an 840-RFID tag and a tattoo; also, all beef/dairy beef cattle must have a DNA hair sample turned into the county office by May 15th.

Please contact your County Extension Office for a collection envelope. For specific ID information related to county fair only animals, please contact your County 4-H Educator.


4-H members (Grades 3 – 12) must identify all Beef and Dairy Cattle, Goats, Horses, Llamas, Sheep and Swine in the 4-H Online system by the species deadline or earlier county deadline if applicable to be eligible for exhibition.

 Beef and Dairy Beef Steers, Beef Heifers, Beef/Dairy Feeder Calves, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Horses, Llamas, Sheep, and Swine must be entered into 4-H Online no later than May 15.


Animal Identification in 4-H Online

Please complete the following steps to identify your livestock in the 4-H Online system.


- 1. Login to your family profile at: https://v2.4honline.com using your family email address and password associated with your 4-H enrollment record.
 - a. If you have forgotten your password, please use the 'Reset password' option on the 4-H Online login page, and you will be sent a new temporary password.
 - b. If you have forgotten your family email address or turned in a paper 4-H enrollment form, please contact your local Purdue Extension Office for assistance.
- 2. Click View next to the Member's record for whom you would like to add an animal



- 3. Click Animals in the navigation pane.
- 4. Click the blue Add an Animal button.







- 6. Select the appropriate animal type from the drop-down menu.
- 7. Enter the required Tag, Tattoo, or Animal Name as directed (see Key)
- 8. Click Save.

- 9. Read the on-screen instructions for Animal ID requirements for County Fair and Indiana State Fair Exhibition.
- 10. Click on the button "Show Questions" after reading the instructions
- 11. Required fields are indicated, but be sure to complete all other visible fields as applicable.
- 12. Click next once completed.
- 13. Upload any files if required or necessary for the particular Animal type.
- 14. Click next once completed.
- 15. Review the entered information. Use the Back button at the bottom of the page to return to the previous screen to make corrections if needed.
- 16. Once the entered information is correct and reviewed, click the Submit button.
- 17. The animal information will display on the screen with the status, created, modified, and submitted date and time stamp (local time). You will also receive a confirmation email upon submission.
- 18. To add more animals for the same member repeat steps 3-17. To add animals for another member return to the Member List and View another member.

Note Members are able to edit Animal ID information until the species specific Animal ID deadline of **May 15th**. Click on the Animals tab from your account at any time to view the status for all of the animals for a member in the family.

Family Enrollment of Animals

Animals are automatically co-enrolled within the same family (Siblings and step-siblings). The animals may be identified under a single 4-H member in 4-H Online and be exhibited by a different sibling listed in the same family profile. With this capability in 4-H Online, animals do not need to be entered under each 4-H member in the family. The exhibit management program will allow a member to select to exhibit any animal identified by the family in 4-H Online. It is suggested that at least 1 animal be identified by each member enrolled in the project.
